

We read in Psalms 65:2

*“O You who hear prayer,
To You **all** flesh will come.”*

Notice, scripture does not say that **some** flesh will come, or **most** flesh will come, but it declares, “To You **All** flesh will come.”

*“O You who hear prayer,
To You **all** flesh will come.”*

The answer to why Yahshua prayed is quite simple. Yahshua was made **“like his brothers in every respect”**. Yahshua was **genuinely** human; **He was born of flesh**. (Romans 9:5; Isaiah 9:6).

Being born of flesh, and in order to **fulfill all righteousness**, Yahshua MessiYah **Himself** prayed as scripture states **all** flesh will do.

**Yahshua said,
“true worshipers will worship the Father”
Yahshua welcomes and accepts
people’s worship**

*“But the hour is coming, and now is, **when the true worshipers** will worship **the Father** in spirit and truth”
John 4:23*

According to Yahshua, **“true worshipers will worship the Father”**.

*And the Scriptures show that people **worshiped Yahshua**.*

From the beginning of Yahshua’s life, **He was worshiped**. Yahshua was worshiped as a baby. Yahshua was worshiped by His disciples. Yahshua was worshiped by everyday people. Yahshua was worshiped by demon possessed people. Yahshua was worshiped after His resurrection.

Yahshua was worshiped and He **welcomed** people’s worship. In **every** instance, Yahshua **welcomed** people’s worship. The Scriptures not only show that Yahshua was worshiped; they show that He **welcomed** and **accepted** worship.

Two memorable examples of Yahshua **accepting** worship occurred just after His resurrection when “Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb.”

*So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word. And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, “Rejoice!” So they came and held Him by the feet and **worshiped Him**.*

Matthew 28:8-9

Question:

Yahshua **clearly** told us...

*“the **true worshipers** will worship **the Father** in spirit and truth”*

Why then did **He** allow people to worship **Him**?

The Answer:

Yahshua allowed people to worship Him because **He was The Almighty Father manifested in flesh**.

*Philip said, “Lord, show us **the Father**.
That is all we need.” Yahshua replied:*

*Philip, I have been with you for a long time.
Don’t you know who I am?*

*If you have seen **me**, you have seen the Father.
How can you ask me to show you the Father?
John 14:8-9*

The Almighty Father manifested Himself in flesh as a man, to do **for us** what we could **NEVER** do for ourselves. **He fulfilled the demands of the Law as a perfect man of flesh**, so that **He** could be **our perfect sacrifice, ‘kinsman redeemer’ and Savior!** On the cross **He** took **ALL** of our sins (**past, present and future**) and put them upon **Himself**, paying **our** price and thereby making us **“holy, blameless”** and **“without a single fault”** in His eyes. (Colossians 1:22)

This is the gospel! **This is the Good News! Everyone** who calls upon the name of Yahshua **will be saved**, so call upon Him now. Tomorrow is not assured.

The invisible Father in the Old Testament became a **visible man** in the New Testament

Most believers know **The Almighty Father** is the **preeminent** figure in the Old Testament. However, many believers do not recognize that the **The Almighty Father is the preeminent** figure in the **New Testament as well**. (Think of Philip not recognizing who Yahshua **actually** was in John 14:8-9)

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** is an **invisible** spirit. In the New Testament, **The Almighty Father is a visible man made of flesh**.

The Apostle Paul tells us that the **invisible** Father of the Old Testament **was manifested (made visible) in flesh**.

*“God was manifested in the flesh”
1 Timothy 3:16*

The Almighty Father appears to Moses

When The Almighty Father appeared to Moses in the burning bush, Moses asked His name.

The Almighty Father gave Moses this reply:

*“I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: ‘**I AM** has sent me to you.’”
Exodus 3:14*

Ever since this name was spoken by The Almighty Father, the Israelites considered the name **“I AM”** to be sacred.

This name was not to be used in vain or bestowed on **anyone** other than **The Almighty Father Himself**.

The Gospel of John tells us that one day the Pharisees came to question Yahshua. At the conclusion, Yahshua responded to their questions by saying this...

*"I tell you the **truth**, before Abraham was born, **I AM!**"*
John 8:58

Here, Yahshua calls **Himself** the ancient and sacred name of The Almighty Father Himself, "**I AM**".

Yahshua proclaimed to them that **He** was **The Almighty Father** of Exodus 3:14 that they **purported** to worship.

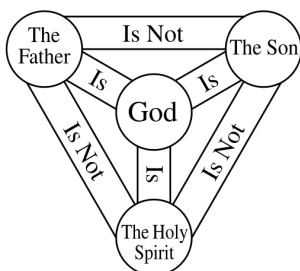
Because the Pharisees knew **exactly** what Yahshua meant, they became enraged and picked up stones to kill Him for blasphemy.

Sadly, there are many people today, who just like the Pharisees, **reject** our Savior's **own words** proclaiming **He is 'I AM', The Almighty Father come manifested in flesh.**

The Almighty Father **is** the **only** I AM

Scriptures **inarguably** show that "**I AM**" is **The Almighty Father**. (Exodus 3:13-14)

According to the 'Trinity Doctrine', "**The Father is NOT the Son**" and "**The Son is NOT the Father**". Therefore, according to the 'Trinity Doctrine', **it is not possible** for Yahshua to be "**I AM**" because **Yahshua is the Son; Yahshua IS NOT the Father.**



The Trinity Diagram

Isaiah's Prophecy – The Almighty Father will be born as a 'Son' (human) made of flesh

The apostle Paul told us, "**God was manifested in the flesh**" and this is **exactly** what the prophet Isaiah **foretold** would happen.

Isaiah told us **The Almighty Father Himself** was going to come to us **born in flesh** as our MessiYah!

*For unto us **a Child is born**, Unto us a **Son** is given;
And the government will be upon His shoulder.
And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor,
Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.*
Isaiah 9:6

Isaiah told us our "**Mighty God**" and "**Everlasting Father**" would come to us as a "**Son**" because He was going to be "**born**" of a woman and would be **a man made of flesh. He would be human!**

Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled

We see Isaiah's prophecy fulfilled in Matthew 1:23,

*"Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a **Son**,
and they shall call His name Immanuel,"
which is translated, "**God with us.**"*
Matthew 1:23

Isaiah 9:6
*unto us a **child is born**... Unto us a **Son** is given...
His name... Mighty God, Everlasting Father*

Matthew 1:23
*the virgin shall be with **child**, and bear a **Son**...
His name... God with us*

If Yahshua was The Almighty Father manifested in flesh... **Why** did He pray?

The **key** to understanding why Yahshua MessiYah (**The Father manifested in flesh**) prayed, can be found in these three scriptures: Matthew 3:15; Hebrews 2:17 and Psalms 65:2.

Matthew 3:13-15

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him. And John tried to **prevent** Him, saying, "I need to be baptized by **You, and are You coming to me?**" But Jesus answered and said to him, "Permit it to be so **now**, for thus it is fitting for us **to fulfill all righteousness.**"

Hebrews 2:17

"Therefore He (Yahshua MessiYah) had to be made like His brothers in every respect."

Questions:

Why would The Almighty Father manifested in flesh **need** to be baptized?

Why would The Almighty Father manifested in flesh **need** to pray?

The Answer:

Yahshua MessiYah prayed **for the same reason** that He was baptized... to **fulfill all righteousness as a man made of flesh.**

The Almighty Father came to us **as a man** manifested in flesh in order to fulfill every 'jot and tittle' of the Law on **our** behalf.

If He failed to 'fulfill all righteousness' **as a man made of flesh**, His entire mission to save us would **fail!**

Yahshua had to 'fulfill all righteousness' **as a man made of flesh**, just like us! He had to **literally** be our '**kinsman redeemer**' to be our **Savior!**
