In the Old Testament, a person teaching The Almighty's people to worship 'three distinct persons' would have been put to death!

The Jewish people were warned continually to stay <u>far away</u> from pagan 'polytheism' by The Almighty Father <u>Himself</u>:

"Hear, O Israel: the LORD our God, the LORD is one!" Deuteronomy 6:4

What divides Jewish people from Trinitarianism is whether The Almighty is One (singular), or a composite of 'three persons'. The bedrock of Judaism has always been true monotheism - the belief that The Almighty is a singular one. This belief in one singular Almighty is what distinguished the Jewish people from their neighbors, who during antiquity were polytheistic.

The Jewish people have always safeguarded their monotheism against Trinitarian proselytizing. To them, the Catholic and Protestant 'Trinity Doctrine' is blasphemous, for they believe the 'trinity god' to be a <u>different</u> god than The Almighty God of Scripture.

How can the Jewish people *(or any Believer)* accept the 'Trinity Doctrine' which tells them The Almighty is comprised of 'three distinct persons', when this <u>refutes</u> the very words of The Almighty Father <u>Himself</u>?

In the Bible, false prophets claimed to speak the Word of God, but instead spread false teachings **contrary** to The Fathers own words. Any prophet who **contradicted** what The Almighty Father had previously revealed in His Word, **proved himself** to be a false prophet.

To <u>protect</u> His people, The Almighty Father <u>commanded false prophets be put to death</u>.

Yahshua <u>Himself</u> tells us who "<u>the true worshipers</u>" are to worship

Yahshua told us, "the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth". (John 4:23)

"But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth"

According to Yahshua, "the true worshipers" will worship the Father".

Revealingly, the Scriptures show us that people worshiped Yahshua. Even from the very beginning of Yahshua's life, *He was worshiped*. Yahshua was worshiped as a baby. Yahshua was worshiped by His disciples. Yahshua was worshiped by everyday people. Yahshua was worshiped by demon possessed people. Yahshua was worshiped after His resurrection.

Two memorable examples of Yahshua accepting worship occurred just after His resurrection when "Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb."

"So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word. And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Yahshua met them, saying, "Rejoice!" So they came and held Him by the feet and worshiped Him."

Matthew 28:8-9

In <u>every instance</u>, the Bible shows us that <u>Yahshua</u> <u>welcomed</u> <u>and</u> <u>accepted</u> <u>peoples</u> <u>worship</u>.

Question:

Yahshua clearly told us...

"the true worshipers will worship the Father
in spirit and truth"

Why then did Yahshua allow people to worship Him?

The Answer:

Yahshua <u>allowed</u> people to worship <u>Him</u> because <u>He was The Almighty Father manifested in flesh</u>.

Believer, please don't worship and pray to three persons

The Almighty Father is the <u>only</u> Savior. He tells us this **Himself**.

I, even I, am the LORD,

And besides Me there is no savior. Isa 43:11

For there is no other God but Me, a righteous God and Savior.

There is none but Me. Isa 45:21

And you shall know no God but Me; For there is no savior besides Me. Hosea 13:4

These scriptures are clear, The Almighty Father repeatedly tells us that <u>He</u> is the <u>only Savior</u>.

Many people however, discard the words of The Almighty Father, choosing instead to heed the words of their denomination which tells them a 'second person' is their Savior, not the Father.

However, <u>nowhere</u> in the Bible does The Almighty Father speak of a 'second person' or a 'third person'. The word "persons" is <u>never</u> used in reference to The Almighty in the Bible.

Furthermore, <u>nowhere</u> in the Bible has any inspired writer ever said The Almighty is '<u>three</u> <u>persons</u>'. Moses, who spoke with Yahweh "face to face, just as a man speaks to his friend" certainly did not. (Exodus 33:11)

Over the years, endless books and articles have been written about the 'Trinity of persons' doctrine, but oddly... Yahshua, the prophets and the apostle Paul (who wrote two thirds of the books in the New Testament) never mention it!

Believer, please know that <u>no one</u> in the entire Bible has ever taught the 'Trinity Doctrine.'

Where did the 'Trinity of persons' doctrine come from?

The doctrine of the 'first person', the 'second person' and the 'third person' came from the Catholic church when it formulated the 'Trinity Doctrine'. The 'Trinity of persons' doctrine was enshrined by the Catholic church at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD.

Shortly thereafter, the Catholic church forced believers to accept the 'Trinity of persons' Doctrine or face condemnation, excommunication and worse. It is well documented in history that multitudes of people were tortured and put to death for refusing to accept the 'Trinity Doctrine'. And for what reason? Because they held on to their belief that The Almighty is a singular One and not three. This fact alone should have sounded the alarm in the Christian world concerning this false doctrine.

- Catholic tradition is <u>equal</u> to the Bible. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 82).
- The 'Immaculate conception' Mary was born without sin and lived a sinless life.
- Mary is the intercessor between God and man.
- The Assumption of Mary Mary never died.
- Purgatory a place of suffering for sins not repented of before dying.
- Indulgences paying money to the Catholic church to get your loved ones out of purgatory.
- Praying to dead saints.

"The Protestant Church took over the doctrine of the Trinity" (from the Catholic church)

"At the time of the Reformation, the Protestant Church took over the doctrine of the Trinity without serious examination."

It is strangely ironic to hear Protestants disparage the 'Catholic church' for its many false doctrines, while being totally unaware that the 'Trinity Doctrine' they embrace comes directly from the Catholic church.

Now, both Catholic and Protestant Churches pray to, and worship 'three distinct persons'

The Catholic Pope Francis told people on January 11, 2015...

"We usually <u>pray to Jesus</u>," Francis said.
"When we pray the Our Father,' we <u>pray to the Father</u>. But we don't pray so much to the Holy Spirit. It is so important to <u>pray to the Holy Spirit</u>."

Three quotes from well known <u>Protestant</u> websites:

- 1. "So our one God is present in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This is the doctrine of the Trinity. It is appropriate to worship all three, and we should be careful to ensure that our worship of one person of the Trinity does not overshadow our worship of any other person of the Trinity."
- 2. "So, in general, pray to the Father; but occasionally, to express their Personhood and your own love for them, telling the Spirit and the Son that you love them and that you would like them to come in fullness is a good thing".

3. "There is only one God, eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Who are co-equal in their essential nature, attributes, and perfection; and each of Whom is to be honored and worshiped as God".

Please look at the words used in these quotes

"It is appropriate to worship all three"

"their personhood"...."your love for them"

"each is to be honored and worshiped as God"

Does this sound like **Biblical monotheism** to you?

Trinitarians will always emphatically say that there is one God. However, here is the deception. The Trinitarians one God, is **not** the **singular Almighty** of scripture. Their god is instead, **one being** that is comprised of 'three distinct **persons**, each fully God'. These three together, make one god.

Trinitarians worship and pray to three divine figures even though their lips are saying, "one God."

Trinitarians say that they are monotheistic and there is one God. However, their *actions* speak much louder than their words, for they worship and pray to 'three distinct persons.' The *practical* reality is that 'Trinitarianism' is an unscriptural and polytheistic form of religion.

Believer, you <u>must understand</u> that even though you may go to a 'Protestant church', <u>its very</u> <u>foundation</u> has nevertheless been <u>built upon</u> the Catholic churches <u>false</u> 'Trinity Doctrine'.
