
There is only one 'I AM'

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** proclaims that **He** is 'I AM' (Exodus 3:14). In the New Testament, **Yahshua Messiah** proclaims that **He** is 'I AM' (John 8:58).

Are there **two** 'I AM's?

No. The Almighty Father is the **only** 'I AM'.

The Apostle Paul gives us understanding.

Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 8:6, **"for us there is one God, the Father."** Paul tells us again in Ephesians 4:6 there is **"one God and Father of all."**

Paul then tells us our **"one God, the Father"**, manifested Himself in flesh.

"God was manifested in the flesh"
1 Timothy 3:16

There is only one **Great God**

In the **Old** Testament **The Almighty Father** is called **'the Great God'**.

In the **New** Testament the Apostle Paul calls **Yahshua Messiah** our **Great God**.

Are there **two** great God's?

No. The Almighty Father is the **only** 'great God'.

In Titus 2:13, the Apostle Paul **clearly identifies by name** who our **great God** and **Savior** is.

*"looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of **our great God** and **Savior** Jesus Christ"*
(Yahshua Messiah)

The Apostle Paul...Titus 2:13

The **invisible** Father in the Old Testament, became a **visible man** in the New Testament

The Bible tells us The Almighty Father manifested **Himself** in flesh as a man, to do for us what we could **NEVER** do for ourselves. He fulfilled the demands of the Law **as a perfect man of flesh**, so that He could be our perfect sacrifice, 'kinsman redeemer' and Savior.

On the cross He took **ALL** of our sins (**past, present and future**) and put them upon Himself, paying our price, and thereby making us **holy, blameless, and without a single fault in His eyes**.

This is the gospel. **This is the Good News**.

Salvation is a **gift** we receive when we call upon Yahshua Messiah, The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.

The **gift** of salvation cannot be earned by our deeds, works, or fruitless self-righteous attempts at keeping the law.

We cannot obtain it by being a good person or by attending church.

Ephesians 2:8 tells us,

*"God saved you by His grace when you believed, and you can't take credit for this, **it is a gift from God.**"*

Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it."

We can only receive our salvation as a **gift** from Yahshua Messiah... **'to us'**.

Everyone who calls upon the name of Yahshua **will be saved**, so call upon Him **now**, tomorrow is not assured.

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Yahshua Messiah tells us **WHY** we must believe He is The Almighty Father manifested in flesh

Yahshua Messiah **Himself** tells us **why** we must believe He is the 'I AM' of Exodus 3:14; **The Almighty Father come manifested in flesh**.

The Almighty Father tells us that **He is the only Savior**

*I, I am Yahweh, **and there is no other Savior but Me.***
Isaiah 43:11

*For there is no other God but Me, a righteous God and Savior. **There is none but Me.***
Isaiah 45:21

*And you shall know no God but Me; **For there is no savior besides Me.***
Hosea 13:4

Believer, The Almighty Fathers words are clear and unmistakable; **they leave no doubt**.

The Almighty Father is **our Savior**; He is the **only Savior**.

The Almighty Father appears to Moses

When The Almighty Father appeared to Moses in the burning bush, Moses asked His name. The Almighty Father gave Moses this reply:

"I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'

Exodus 3:14

Believer, it is unarguable that 'I AM' is The Almighty Father.

Ever since this name was spoken by The Almighty Father, the Israelites considered the name "I AM" to be sacred.

This name was not to be used in vain or bestowed on anyone other than The Almighty Father Himself.

The Gospel of John tells us that one day the Pharisees came to question Yahshua.

Yahshua responded to their questions saying,

"I tell you the truth, before Abraham was born, I AM!"

John 8:58

Here, Yahshua calls Himself the ancient and sacred name of The Almighty Father, 'I AM'.

Yahshua proclaimed to the Pharisees (and us) that He was 'I AM', The Almighty Father of Exodus 3:14 that they purported to worship.

The Pharisees became enraged when Yahshua said that He was 'I AM' and they picked up stones to kill Him for blasphemy.

Sadly, there are many people today, who just like the Pharisees, reject our Savior's own words proclaiming His identity as being 'I AM', The Almighty Father who had come to them manifested in flesh.

Yahshua tells the Pharisees (and us) something VITAL

"Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins; for if you do not believe that I am He, you will die in your sins."

John 8:24

Notice the "He" in this verse is in italics, which means that it was not in the original Greek, but was added by the translators. The "He" in italics was NOT spoken by Yahshua. This added word completely obscures the fact that Yahshua proclaimed to the Pharisees that He was the 'I AM' of the Old Testament... The Almighty Father. (Exodus 3:14, John 8:58).

The Greek words translated as "I am" are 'EGO EIMI' which is, "I AM".

John 8:24 is actually as follows,

"Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins; for if you do not believe that I AM, you will die in your sins."

Thirty four verses later in John 8:58, Yahshua emphatically repeats His declaration that He is I AM, The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.

"Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM."

What Yahshua told the Pharisees (and us) is clear and unambiguous, it is not open to more than one interpretation. His message is this, if you do not believe that 'I AM', The Almighty Father of Exodus 3:14 you will die in your sins.

Believer's we must understand that when Yahshua told the Pharisees they must believe that He was The Almighty Father of Exodus 3:14 or they would die in their sins... He was speaking to to us as well.

According to Yahshua, rightly believing who He is, is essential for salvation. A 'different Jesus', or another version of Jesus, is not acceptable. Yahshua makes it clear that for a person to be saved from sin, they must believe that He is The Almighty Father of Exodus 3:14 come in flesh.

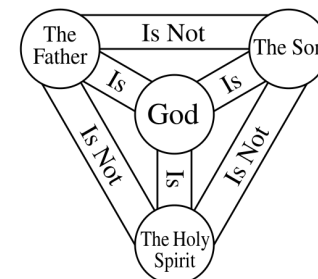
Why must this be?

The answer is because The Almighty Father, as scripture states, is the only Savior! The Almighty Father is the only one that can save someone from their sins; there is no other Savior! Thus, if a person does not believe that Yahshua is The Almighty Father and only Savior, they will die in their sins.

Today, people engage in intellectual debates about who the Father is. Is our Savior the Father; is our Savior a 'second person' in the Trinity Doctrine? But Yahshua is having none of it, He speaks clearly and truthfully to those who will listen. He is I AM, and no debating or intellectualizing will change that. No man, tradition or denomination will change that.

The Trinity Doctrine's 'I AM' Problem

Scriptures unarguably show that I AM is The Almighty Father. Scriptures unarguably show that Yahshua said He was I AM. The Trinity Doctrine however, states "The Father is NOT the Son" and "The Son is NOT the Father". Therefore, according to the Trinity Doctrine, it is not possible for Yahshua to be 'I AM' because Yahshua is the Son; He is NOT the Father.
