

'One' believers and 'Trinitarian' believers – What is the difference?

Let's first look at the definitions of these words.

trinity: the cardinal number that is the sum of one and one and one

Syn: three, 3, III, trio, threesome, triad

one: 1. the smallest whole number or a numeral representing this number

2. a single person or thing.

Syn: 1, I, single

Let's look at the basic differences separating these beliefs

1. Trinitarians believe that the Almighty is one being that is a composite of three distinct persons. (Question: *Honestly, who can relate to, or have a personal relationship with one being that is comprised of three distinct persons?*)

Those who believe the Almighty is one, believe that He is one (singular), and there are no '**other distinct persons**' involved. (*It is very easy and comforting to have a personal relationship with Him!*)

2. Trinitarians believe it was 'the second person' of the Trinity that was manifested in flesh and not the Almighty Father. Those who believe the Almighty is one (singular) believe that the Almighty Father Himself was manifested in flesh as Isaiah prophesied.

*For unto us a **Child is born**,
Unto us a **Son** is given;
And the government will be upon His shoulder.
And His name will be called
Wonderful, Counselor, **Mighty God**,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.*

Isaiah 9:6

3. Trinitarians believe that the 'second person' has always been eternal. Those who believe the Almighty is one, believe that the "**Son**" did not come into being until the Almighty Father was manifested in flesh as the "**Son**", just as Isaiah had prophesied.
