

The 'Son of God' is The Almighty Father – just ask Philip

What does the term, “**Son of God**” mean? Does it mean that God the Father literally had a son? The answer to that question is just plainly no.

The term “Son of God” does not mean that Yahshua is the literal offspring of God as old Catholic Trinitarian paintings would have you believe.



This picture depicts The Almighty Father as an old man with a long white beard.

Scripture however, tells us The Almighty Father is **not** an old man with a long white beard; He is an ***invisible Spirit***.

In the New Testament, the Bible tells us the invisible **Almighty Father** made Himself **visible** to us ***as a man*** made of flesh, who was called the '**Son of God**'.

“God was manifested in flesh”

1 Timothy 3:16

The Apostle Paul does **not** say, God’s ‘son’ was manifested in flesh.

What did the term, 'Son of God' mean to believers of that day?

During His trial before the Jewish leaders, the High Priest demanded of Yahshua,

*"I charge you under oath by the living God: Tell us if you are the MessiYah, the **Son of God!** Yahshua said to him, It is as you said"*

The Jewish leaders responded to this by accusing Yahshua of blasphemy.

Later, before Pontius Pilate...

*"The Jews insisted, 'We have a law, and according to that law He must die, because **He claimed to be the Son of God.**'"* John 19:7

Why would Yahshua claiming to be the 'Son of God' be considered blasphemy and be worthy of a death sentence? What did the term, '**Son of God**' mean to the Jewish leaders of that day?

The Bible actually defines the phrase '**Son of God**' for us in John 10:31-36. The passage tells us that some of the Jewish people wanted to kill Yahshua MessiYah by stoning Him to death because He called Himself the '**Son of God**'.

*For which of those works do you stone me?" The Jews answered Him, saying, "For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy, and because You, being a Man, **make Yourself God.**"*

The Jewish leaders, understood exactly what Yahshua meant by the term 'Son of God'. They knew that when Yahshua proclaimed to be the 'Son of God', He was proclaiming to be **The Almighty Father Himself manifested in flesh.**

We must always remember that these Jewish leaders were strictly monotheistic!

When they said, "*You, being a Man make Yourself God*", they were **not** talking about a 'second person' in the Trinity Doctrine! They were talking about the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; the "**I AM**".

John 8:56-58 records Yahshua trying to help them understand that **He** was
The Almighty Father of the Old Testament.

*“Your father Abraham rejoiced to see My day, and he saw it and was glad.”
Then the Jews said to Him, “You are not yet fifty years old,
and have You seen Abraham?”*

Yahshua then said to them,

*“Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, **I AM**.”*

Notice that Yahshua called Himself, “**I AM**”. **This is The Almighty Fathers name.**
(Exodus 3:6 and 14)

Yahshua was telling them that **He** was **The Almighty Father** they worshipped - the
God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

Why did the Father manifest Himself in flesh as the Son?

The invisible Father manifested Himself **in flesh as a man** in order to fulfill 'the Law' on our behalf and become our sacrifice, substitute, high priest, 'kinsman redeemer' and Savior.

All these roles required a man to fulfill them, and that is why The Almighty Father came into the world in flesh... as a man.



The Almighty Father tells us in Isaiah 43:11

"there is no other Savior but Me."

If Yahshua was the Father manifested in flesh, why did He pray?

The key to understanding why Yahshua Messiyah (God manifested in flesh) prayed, can be found in these two scriptures: Matthew 3:15 and Hebrews 2:17.

Matthew 3:13-15

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him.

And John tried to prevent Him, saying,

"I need to be baptized by You, and are You coming to me?"

But Jesus answered and said to him,

"Permit it to be so now, for thus it is fitting for us

to fulfill all righteousness."

Hebrews 2:17

*“Therefore He (Yahshua MessiYah) had to be
made like His brothers in every respect.”*

Questions:

Why would The Almighty Father manifested in flesh need to be baptized?

Why would The Almighty Father manifested in flesh need to pray?

The Answer:

Yahshua MessiYah prayed for the same reason that He was baptized; to **fulfill all righteousness.**

The Almighty Father came to us manifested in flesh (Yahshua MessiYah) in order to fulfill every ‘jot and tittle’ of the Law on **our** behalf.

If He failed to **fulfill all righteousness**, His entire mission to save us would fail!

Yahshua had to **fulfill all righteousness** as a man **made of flesh**, just like us!
He had to be literally our ‘**kinsman redeemer**’ to be our **Savior**!

We read in Psalms 65:2

*“O You who hear prayer,
To You **all** flesh will come.”*

Notice, scripture does not say that some flesh will come, or most flesh will come, but it declares, “To You **all** flesh will come.”

*“O You who hear prayer,
To You **all** flesh will come.”*

The answer to why Yahshua prayed is quite simple. Yahshua was made “*like his brothers in every respect*”. Yahshua was genuinely human; He was made of flesh (Romans 9:5).

Being made in flesh and in order to fulfill all righteousness, Yahshua Messiyah Himself prayed as scripture states all flesh will do.

“one God and Father of all”

Scripture clearly tell us there is no Savior but The Almighty Father Himself! (Isaiah 43:11; Isaiah 45:21; Hosea 13:4)

Isaiah prophesied that the “Son” who was to come would be called “Mighty God” and “Everlasting Father”. (Isaiah 9:6)

Yahshua was “a Son” because He was born of a woman (*unto us a child is born... Unto us a Son is given*) and at one and the same time, He is our Mighty God and Everlasting Father in His deity.

We see Isaiah’s prophesy fulfilled in Matthew 1:23,

*“Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son,
and they shall call His name Immanuel,”
which is translated, “God with us.”*

Isaiah 9:6

*unto us a child is born... Unto us a Son is given...
His name... Mighty God, Everlasting Father*

Matthew 1:23

*the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son...
His name... God with us*

Many fail to comprehend that The Almighty Father can be in Heaven filling the universe with His majesty and yet, at the same time, He can manifest His glory among us in the tent of a human body.

Paul tells us in Ephesians 4:6 there is “**one God and Father of all**”. Since we know that Yahshua is God, we know that according to Scripture, **He is The Almighty Father**.

Scripture clearly tell us there is **no Savior** but The Almighty Father **Himself**
(Isaiah 43:11; Isaiah 45:21; Hosea 13:4)

*looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing
of our great **God and Savior Jesus Christ***

The Apostle Paul...Titus 2:13

**The ‘Trinity Doctrine’ is the main reason why Jewish people
reject the Gospel.**

Remember, the Jewish people were warned continually to stay **far away** from pagan ‘polytheism’ by The Almighty Himself:

*“Hear, O Israel: the LORD our God,
the LORD is one!”*

Deuteronomy 6:4

How can the Jewish people accept the unscriptural ‘Trinity Doctrine’ which tells them The Almighty is **one entity consisting of ‘three separate and distinct persons’**, when The Almighty Father **Himself** repeatedly told them He is singular; He is **One**.

What divides Jewish people from Trinitarianism is whether The Almighty is One (singular), or a composite of 'three persons'. The bedrock of Judaism has always been strict monotheism - the belief that The Almighty is a singular One. This belief in one singular Almighty is what distinguished the Jewish people from their neighbors, who during antiquity were polytheistic.

The Jewish people have always safeguarded their monotheism against Trinitarian proselytizing. To them, the Catholic and Protestant 'Trinity Doctrine' is blasphemous, for they believe the 'trinity god' to be a different god than The Almighty God of Scripture.

How can the Jewish people (*or any Believer*) accept the 'Trinity Doctrine' which tells them the Almighty is comprised of 'three distinct persons', when this refutes the very Words of the Almighty Father Himself?

The Trinity Doctrine is foreign to the Jewish people who believe in the singular, One Almighty Father of heaven and earth.

In the Old Testament, people who taught this doctrine would have been put to death!

Many Trinitarians have never examined the Trinity Doctrine for themselves. They do not know its origins or how it came to be. They have accepted this doctrine even though nowhere in the Bible is the teaching of this doctrine found.

What 'The New Encyclopedia Britannica' says about the Trinity Doctrine:

"Neither the word Trinity nor the explicit doctrine appears in the New Testament." In addition, Yale University professor E. Washburn Hopkins observed: "To Jesus and Paul the doctrine of the trinity was apparently unknown; they say nothing about it."

Where did the Trinity Doctrine come from?

The Trinity Doctrine evolved under the influence of the Roman Catholic Church. It took over 300 years to formulate the main elements of this doctrine at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD. Ultimately, the Catholic church forced believers to accept the 'Trinity Doctrine' or face condemnation, excommunication and worse. It is well documented in history that multitudes of people were tortured and put to death for refusing to accept the Trinity Doctrine. This fact alone should have sounded the alarm in the Christian world concerning this doctrine.

How did Protestants become Trinitarians?

*“At the time of the Reformation, the Protestant Church took over the doctrine of the Trinity (from the Catholic church), **without serious examination.**”*

New International Encyclopedia; 1916 Ed.; Vol. 23; p 47, 477

Most Protestant Trinitarians do not realize that the 'Trinity Doctrine' they espouse **comes directly from the Catholic church.**

Both Catholic and Protestant Trinitarians teach their followers to worship and pray to 'three distinct persons'.

The Catholic Pope Francis, told people on January 11, 2015...

*“We usually pray to **Jesus**,” Francis said. “When we pray the Our Father,’ we pray to the **Father**. But we don’t pray so much to the Holy Spirit. It is so important to pray to the **Holy Spirit.**”*

Here are three quotes from well-known Protestant websites:

1. "So our one God is present in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This is the doctrine of the Trinity. It is appropriate **to worship all three**, and we should be careful to ensure that our worship of one person of the Trinity does not overshadow our worship of **any other person** of the Trinity."
2. "So, in general, pray to the Father; but occasionally, to express their Personhood and your own love for **them**, telling the Spirit and the Son that **you love them** and that you would like **them** to come in fullness is a good thing".
3. "There is only one God, eternally existing in **three** persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Who are co-equal in their essential nature, attributes, and perfection; and **each of Whom is to be honored and worshiped as God**".

Please look at the words used in these quotes.

"worship all three" **"you love them"** **"each worshiped"**

Does this sound like Biblical monotheism to you?

Trinitarian churches teach their followers to worship and pray to **three distinct persons**. This is totally unscriptural for it is **polytheism**.

Please look at the words used in these quotes.

"worship all three" **"you love them"** **"each worshiped"**

Does this sound like Biblical monotheism to you?

In the Old Testament, a person teaching The Almighty's people to worship 'three distinct persons' would have been put to death

Moses met and spoke with The Almighty many times, twice for periods of 40 days each. Moses climbed Mt. Sinai eight times to meet with The Almighty.



The Almighty says of Moses,

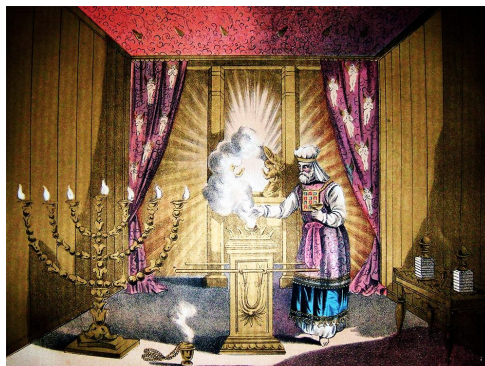
*"I speak with him directly, openly, and not in riddles,
He sees the form of the LORD."*

Numbers 12:8

The Almighty said to Moses,

"I will meet with you there above the mercy seat, between the two cherubim that are over the ark of the testimony; I will speak with you from there about all I that I command you regarding the Israelites."

Exodus 25:22



The Almighty said He speaks with Moses “**directly**”, “**openly**” and “**He sees the form of the LORD**”, yet Moses never wrote The Almighty is three persons.

Moses did write,

“Hear, Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD is one!

What Moses wrote agrees with both the Old and the New Testament which tell us there is but One God, the Father. (Malachi 2:10: 1 Corinthians 8:6; Ephesians 4:6) The Almighty has told us He is One, but **never** that He is three.

In the Bible, false prophets were people who claimed to speak the Word of God but instead spread false messages and teachings. The true prophet’s message always lined up with the Word of God in Scripture whereas the false prophet’s teaching was inconsistent and contrary with what Scripture said.

Any prophet who contradicted what The Almighty had previously revealed in His Word proved himself to be false. The Almighty commanded false prophets be put to death.

The Jewish people are absolutely correct in believing in the absolute oneness and singularity of The Almighty.

‘Person(s)’ in reference to The Almighty, is not in the Bible, it is not scriptural nor is there a commandment to worship ‘three persons’. It is Scripturally incorrect to speak of The Almighty as a ‘trinity’ or ‘triad’ of ‘persons.’ **Nowhere** in the Bible is this doctrine taught. This makes the ‘Trinity Doctrine’ an unscriptural and false doctrine.

The New Testament aligns itself perfectly with the beliefs of the Jewish people who believe The Almighty is one (really one in singularity), as they were correctly taught by Moses, the prophets and The Almighty Father Himself.

The ‘Trinity Doctrine’ should **never** be associated with the Christian faith. The Almighty is **ONE** and **He** has revealed Himself to us in the New Testament as **YAH**-shua the MessiYah. (2 Corinthians 4:6)

**Philip requested to see the Father –
Yahshua replied, “*Don’t you know who I am?*”**

Philip said, “Lord, show us the Father. That is all we need.”

Jesus replied:

*Philip, I have been with you for a long time. ***Don't you know who I am?****

If you have seen me, you have seen the Father.

How can you ask me to show you the Father?

John 14:8-9 CEV

Philip walked with, talked with, ate with and witnessed the miracles of Yahshua every day... and yet ***Philip did not know who Yahshua truly was!***

Like many people today, Philip did not comprehend that The Almighty Father is an invisible Spirit and that the only way anyone could ever see Him would be by looking at Yahshua MessiYah ***who is The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.***
(1 Timothy 3:16; Isaiah 9:6)

My friends have you been like Philip before Yahshua opened the eyes of his understanding?

Have you, like Philip, been walking and talking with Yahshua every day and not ***yet*** realized who Yahshua truly is? He is The Almighty Father ***Himself*** manifested in flesh to be our Savior.

If you asked Yahshua to see ***the Father***, what do you think He would say to ***you?***

Jesus replied:

I have been with you for a long time.

Don't you know who I am?
