
The 'Trinity Doctrine' is the main reason why Jewish people reject the Gospel.

Remember, the Jewish people were warned continually to stay **far away** from pagan 'polytheism' by the Almighty Himself:

*"Hear, O Israel: the LORD our God,
the LORD is one!"*

Deuteronomy 6:4

If you study the 'Trinity' in other religions, you will see the relationship between the 'Trinity Doctrine' and the false gods of these religions.

There are a number of faiths that consider Christians to be idolaters and infidels because some try to push the theory of 'three persons' in one Almighty. The 'three person' theory is foreign to true Christianity and to Jewish people that believe in the one Almighty of heaven and earth.

How can the Jewish people accept, or even understand the unscriptural 'Trinity Doctrine' which attempts to tell them that the Almighty is 'three persons'.

The Jewish people are absolutely correct in believing in the 'absolute oneness' of the Almighty, and that same oneness can be proven in the New Testament. It is biblically incorrect to speak of the Almighty as a 'trinity' or 'trio' of *persons*.

'Person(s)' in reference to the Almighty, is not in the Bible, it is not scriptural, nor is there a commandment to worship 'three persons'. This makes the 'Trinity Doctrine' an unscriptural and false doctrine.

The New Testament aligns itself perfectly with the beliefs of the Jewish people who believe the Almighty is one (really one), as they were correctly taught in the Old Testament.

The 'Trinity Doctrine' should **never** be associated with the Christian faith. The Almighty is **ONE** person and He has revealed Himself to us as **YAH**-shua, the Messiyah. (2 Corinthians 4:6)

The 'Trinity Doctrine' was never part of the early church. They knew the Almighty Father manifested **Himself** to us in human form, **as** the Son, just as Isaiah prophesied.

*For unto us a Child is born,
Unto us a **Son** is given;
And the government will be upon His shoulder.
And His name will be called Wonderful,
Counselor, **Mighty God, Everlasting Father,**
Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6)*

Philip asked to see the Father, not knowing who Yahshua actually was.

The Apostle Philip walked with, talked with, ate with and witnessed the miracles of Yahshua every day... and yet **Philip did not know who Yahshua truly was!**

In John 14:7 Yahshua told His disciples, "If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also; and from now on **you know Him and have seen Him.**" Upon hearing this statement, Philip requested, "Lord, **show us the Father**, and it is sufficient for us."

Yahshua responded perplexed, "Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me **has seen the Father**; so how can you say, 'Show us the Father'?"

Like many people today, Philip had not comprehended that the Father is an invisible Spirit and that the only way anyone could ever see Him would be by looking at Yahshua the Messiyah. "God was manifested in the flesh" (1 Timothy 3:16).

My friends have you been like Philip before Yahshua opened the eyes of his understanding? Have you walked and talked with Yahshua every day... and not comprehended who He truly is, the Almighty **Father Himself** who was manifested in flesh to save us from our sins.

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The 'Son of God' is The Father Manifested in Flesh

Many people think the 'Son of God' is referring to a 'second person' in the Trinity Doctrine (God's kid). Scripture however, tells us the '**Son of God**' is the Almighty Father **Himself**.

Sadly, Trinitarian indoctrination occurs in both Catholic and Protestant 'churches' around the world.

*"At the time of the Reformation, the **Protestant Church** took over the doctrine of the Trinity, (from the Catholic Church) without serious examination."*

How is this Trinitarian painting indoctrinating people with unscriptural beliefs?



1) It depicts the Almighty Father as an old man with a long white beard. 2) It depicts the Father as having a son, who is the 'Son of God'; teaching the Father is **not** the 'Son of God'. 3) It depicts three person's in Heaven, not the **one** Almighty Father. (*The Holy Spirit is represented by the dove at the top of the picture.*)

But here is the problem. Scripture tells us the Father is **not** an old man with a long white beard; He is an **invisible Spirit**. Furthermore, Scripture tells us the invisible **Father** made Himself **visible** in flesh **as a man**, who was called the '**Son of God**'.

"God was manifested in flesh" (1 Timothy 3:16)

What did the term, 'Son of God' actually mean to the believers of that day?

During His trial before the Jewish leaders, the High Priest demanded of Yahshua,

"I charge you under oath by the living God: Tell us if you are the Messiyah, the Son of God! Yahshua said to him, It is as you said"

The Jewish leaders responded to this by accusing Yahshua of blasphemy. Later, before Pontius Pilate,

"The Jews insisted, 'We have a law, and according to that law He must die, because He claimed to be the Son of God.'" John 19:7

Why would Yahshua claiming to be the 'Son of God' be considered blasphemy and be worthy of a death sentence? What did the term, '**Son of God**' actually mean to the Jewish leaders of that day?

The Bible actually defines the phrase 'Son of God' in John 10:31-36. The passage tells us that some Jews wanted to kill Yahshua by stoning Him to death because He called Himself the 'Son of God'.

Then the Jews took up stones again to stone Him. Yahshua answered them, "Many good works I have shown you from My Father. For which of those works do you stone me?" The Jews answered Him, saying, "For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy, and because You, being a Man, make Yourself God."

The Jewish leaders, understood exactly what Yahshua meant by the term 'Son of God'. They knew that when Yahshua proclaimed to be the 'Son of God', He was proclaiming to be **The Almighty Father manifested in flesh**.

We must always remember that these Jewish leaders were strictly **monotheistic**! When they said, "*You, being a Man make Yourself God*", they were **not** talking about a 'second person' in the Trinity Doctrine! They were talking about the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; the "**I AM**".

The title 'Son of God' to the believers of that day meant the Almighty Father had manifested Himself in flesh... as a *man*.

John 8:56-58 records Yahshua trying to help them understand that **He** was the Almighty Father of the Old Testament.

*"Your father Abraham rejoiced to see My day, and he saw it and was glad."
Then the Jews said to Him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have You seen Abraham?"*

Yahshua said to them,

"Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM."

Notice that Yahshua called Himself, "I AM". **This is the name the Almighty Father called Himself** in Exodus 3:6 and 14.

Yahshua was telling them that **He** was the Almighty Father they worshipped - the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

Why did the Father manifest Himself as the Son

The invisible Father manifested Himself in flesh as a man in order to fulfill 'the Law' on **our** behalf and become **our** sacrifice, substitute, kinsman-redeemer, reconciler, advocate and high priest.

All these roles required a **man** to fulfill them, and **that** is why the Father came into the world as flesh... a *man*.



The Almighty Father tells us in Isaiah 43:11

*"there is no other Savior but **Me**."*

Why did Yahshua pray to the Father?

The key to understanding why Yahshua prayed to the Father can be found in Hebrews 2:17.

*"Therefore [Yahshua] had to be made like his brothers **in every respect**." Hebrews 2:17*

The answer to why Yahshua prayed is quite simple. Yahshua was genuinely human; He was made of flesh.

We read in Psalms 65:2,

*"O thou who hearest prayer,
unto thee shall all flesh come."*

Now, it does not say that unto The Almighty shall *some* flesh come or *most* flesh come, but it declares,

*"O thou who hearest prayer,
unto thee shall **all** flesh come."*

Prayer was instituted not for the Creator, but for created beings. Yahshua, according to Romans 9:5, was flesh; therefore He too prayed.

"one God and Father of all"

Scripture clearly tell us there is **no** Savior but the Almighty Father **Himself!** (Isaiah 43:11; Isaiah 45:21; Hosea 13:4) The Almighty Father promised us that **He** would come to earth and that **He alone** was our Savior.

Isaiah prophesied that the "**Son**" who was to come would be called "**Mighty God**" and "**Everlasting Father**". (Isaiah 9:6) Yahshua was the prophesied Son in His humanity, but He is our **Mighty God** and **Father** in His deity. Coming as the prophesied 'Son', **the Almighty Father** became the perfect, spotless, sinless **man** who could qualify to be the sacrifice for **our** sins.

Ephesians 4:6 tells us there is "**one God and Father of all**". Since we know that Yahshua is God, we **know** that He is the Father. When a person believes in the name Yahshua, he is believing in what that name means; that YAH, the Almighty Father, is the Savior in human form.
