
Just think, every time you see the 972 times 'Jesus' is written in the New Testament, it is actually the name **YAH-shua** which means, **YAH is salvation!**

And, we must not forget the scriptures in the Book of Revelation which tell us the great multitude in heaven are shouting Hallelu**YAH!** which means: Praise **YAH!** Revelation 19:1,3,4,6

So, don't let anyone tell you The Almighty Father's name is not in the New Testament, because **His name is on almost every page!**

There are a number of faiths that consider Christians to be idolators and infidels because some try to push the theory of 'three persons' in one Almighty. The 'three person' theory is foreign to true Christianity and to Jewish people that believe in the one Almighty of heaven and earth.

The New Testament aligns itself perfectly with the beliefs of the Jewish people who believe in **one singular Almighty**, as they were taught by The Almighty Father **Himself** and His prophets in the Old Testament.

The Almighty's true name...

The Almighty's true Hebrew name **YAH-shua**, has been **needlessly** transliterated three times over the centuries! First to 'leousus', then to 'Iesus' and then to 'Jesus' in the 17th century.

Because of this, our Savior's real name 'Yahshua', is virtually unknown to people!

Yahshua has blessed us however, because of our love and faith in Him! He allowed us to grow spiritually through the names that people have known Him by over the years. Names such as 'leousus', 'Iesus', and 'Jesus' have been a blessing to those who used them **because they had not known His true name.**

What **now** are we to do with our new given knowledge?

I'm reminded of a time I mistakingly called someone I had met by a name not their own. This person very politely told me what their name actually was (*I guess all of us desire to be called by our real name*). Anyway, from that moment on I always called him by his true name.

I would like to leave you with this thought to deeply ponder...

If Yahshua is not the name of The Father, then the name of The Father is NOT in the New Testament!

But please know this...

The name The Almighty Father chose for Himself, **is** found 942 times in the New Testament!

And the name The Almighty Father chose as **His... is YAHshua!**

Salvation is a gift for you!

Salvation is a gift that we receive by faith. We cannot **earn** it through our deeds, works, or by our 'attempted efforts at Law keeping'. We cannot obtain it by being a "good person" or by attending church. Yahshua earned it **for us** by dying for **ALL our** sins on the cross.

The Almighty Father's name is found on almost every page of the New Testament!

A Jewish man once said to me, "*Do you realize that The Almighty Father's name in the Old Testament, is not even mentioned one time, in the New Testament?*"

I politely told him I believed he was mistaken, as The Almighty Father's name could be found literally hundreds of times in the New Testament. He gave me a disbelieving look and asked, "*Can you prove that?*"

"Yes", I replied, "*it's very easy to do.*"

I asked him if he was comfortable using King David and the prophet Isaiah for our references regarding The Almighty Father's name in the Old Testament.

"Sure", he replied, "*I guess if any two people in the Old Testament would know The Almighty Father's name it would be King David and the prophet Isaiah.*"

"Okay", I said, "*Let's get started, it won't take long.*"

Let's first read the words of King David in Psalm 68:4 where He declares The Almighty Father's name.

*Sing to God, sing praises to His name; Extol Him who rides on the clouds, By His name **YAH**, And rejoice before Him.*

Now, let's turn to Isaiah 12:2 and read the words of the prophet Isaiah.

*Behold, God is my salvation,
I will trust and not be afraid; 'For **YAH**,
the LORD, is my strength and song;
He also has become my salvation.'*

I then showed my Jewish friend all the other scriptures which show The Almighty Father's name in the Old Testament is **YAH**.

YAH: (YAH - Strong's H3050)

Exodus 15:2; Exodus 17:16; Psalm 68:4,18; Psalm 77:11; Psalm 89:8; Palm 94:7, 12; Psalm 102:18; Psalm 104:35; Psalm 105:45; Psalm 106:1, 48; Psalm 111:1; Psalm 112:1; Psalm 113:1; Psalm 113:9; Psalm 115:17, 18; Psalm 116:19; Psalm 117:2; Psalm 118:5, 14, 17, 18, 19; Psalm 122:4; Psalm 130:3; Psalm 135:1, 3, 4, 21; Psalm 146:1, 10; Psalm 147:1, 20; Psalm 148:1, 14; Psalm 149:1, 9; Psalm 150:1, 6; Isaiah 12: 2; Isaiah 26:4; Isaiah 38:11.

The name 'Yahweh' (**YAH**-weh) is The Father's name **YAH**, **followed** by a 'descriptor'. The descriptor is the word 'weh', which means, 'The Self-Existent one' (I AM). So, the name **YAH**-weh means, '**YAH** - The Self-Existent one'.

I then asked him, "Have I proven to your satisfaction that scriptures clearly show that The Almighty Father's name in the Old Testament is **YAH**?"

"Yes", he said, "How can I argue with King David, the prophet Isaiah and all those scriptures!"

"Okay", I said, "Now, I will show you The Almighty Father's name in the New Testament; it is recorded hundreds and hundreds of times."

In Mathew 1:20-21, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph and said **he was to call the new born Savior, Yahshua (YAH-shua)**. Let's remember the angel who spoke to Joseph did not speak to him in English, Latin or Greek, but in **Hebrew**.

*"You see, the Almighty Father of the Old Testament, **is The Almighty Savior of the New Testament!** And, His name, is **YAH-shua!**"*

*I, I am **YAH**-weh, and there is **no** other **Savior** but **Me**. Isaiah 43:11*

If we could go back in time...

If we could go back in time and ask the disciples, "Would you take us to see 'Jesus'?" They would have gotten a puzzled look on their face and said, "**Who?**" You see, the disciples **never** knew the **Savior by the name 'Jesus'**. They would have said, "Please come, we want you to meet **YAHshua, the MessiYah!** (Isaiah 9:6)

The History of the name 'Jesus'

For fifteen hundred years after our Savior walked the earth, the world had **never** heard the name 'Jesus'. Why? **Because that name did not exist.**

You can see the name 'Jesus' is **not** in the King James Bible published in 1611. Instead, you will find the name 'Iesus'. The name 'Jesus' **first** appeared in the Revised King James Bible published in 1769, **just 249 years ago!***

** Perhaps the biggest difference between the 1611 and 1769 versions of the King James Bible is spelling. For instance, **there was no letter "J" in 1611** so "Jesus" was spelled "Iesus." TheKJVstore.com*

By 1769, our Saviors 'Heaven sent' Hebrew name 'Yahshua', had been transliterated three times, in three different languages!

- The first, from Hebrew to Greek.
- The second, from Greek to Latin.
- The third, from Latin to English.

Tragically ... and shamefully, the result of these 'man-made' changes was the complete **removal of The Almighty's name!**

*"So, when you see the multi-transliterated name 'Jesus' in the New Testament, you know **His true, 'Heaven given' name, is Yahshua (YAH-shua)!**"*

He then asked, "What does Yahshua mean?" I explained, "In the Hebrew language, names have meaning, they are meant to make a statement, and such is the case with The Almighty's name, **YAH-shua.**"

In the New Testament, The Almighty Father now **combines** His name **YAH**, with His **highest** 'descriptor' ever!"

"What is His **highest** descriptor?" he asked.

It is the word 'shua', which means "**is salvation**". When you combine The Almighty's name **YAH**, with the word 'shua', it means, "**YAH is salvation!**" The Almighty Father is proclaiming **His name to us as Savior! This is why the name YAH-shua, is the name above every name!**

When a person believes in the name **YAH-shua**, he is believing in what that name **means** - that **YAH**, The Almighty Father, **is our Savior who was manifest (made visible) in human form.**

... **God** was manifested in the flesh...

1 Timothy 3:16

The Apostle Paul does **not** say God's 'son' was manifested in the flesh.
